

# **Pharmaceuticals & Medications**

ProMED Tasmania is licenced to carry and administer:



- Antacid (Mylanta®) Gastric reflux & heartburn
- Aspirin Acute coronary syndrome & pulmonary oedema
- Artificial Tears (Refresh®) Irritated/scratched/dry eyes
- Glucose (Oral/IV Fluid) Hypoglycaemic emergencies
- Glucagon Hypoglycaemic emergencies and anaphylaxis
- GTN Spray Acute coronary syndrome & pulmonary oedema
- Ibuprofen (Nurofen®) Mild pain, soft tissue injuries and fever
- Itch Spray (Stingoes®) Bites and stings
- IV Fluids (Saline/Hartmanns) Fluid replacement and therapy
- Loperamide (Gastrostop®) Gastroenteritis and diarrhoea
- Loratadine (Claryntyne®) Mild allergies and hay fever
- Methoxyflurane ("Green Whistle") Moderate/severe pain
- Naloxone Opiate overdoses
- Nitrous Oxide ("Happy Gas") Moderate/severe pain
- Oral Rehydration (Gastrolyte®) Dehydration and gastroenteritis
- Oxygen Variety of injuries and illnesses
- Paracetamol (Panamax®) Mild pain and fever
- Salbutamol (Ventolin®) Asthma and anaphylaxis






## 6x3m Branded Marquee

#### OUR FLEET

ProMED Tasmania has a range of vehicles to provide services across a broad range of event environments being purpose built and reliable.

#### **Standard Stretcher Vehicles**

Our fleet of standard stretcher vehicles is made up of Mercedes Sprinters that are equipped with our standard inventory of medical equipment, supplies and consumables. They are fitted with a Ferno 50E stretcher and can accommodate a second stretcher if necessary.





## **4WD Stretcher Vehicles**

Our fleet of 4WD stretcher vehicles is made up of Nissan Pathfinders that have been expertly modified to support our operations. Each of these vehicles is equipped with a Ferno 50E stretcher as well as our standard inventory of medical equipment, consumables and supplies.

# **Response Vehicles**

Our fleet of response vehicles is made up of a mixture of sedans, crew-cab utilities and SUV's that are equipped with our standard inventory of medical equipment, consumables and supplies. Please note that these vehicles do not have the ability to transport patients.

Our fleet of E-MTB response bikes is made up of Avanti Montari-e Performance with a Bosch Gen 3 Performance Line Motor. Staff provided with these bikes have extensive downhill, cross-country and endurance experience and carry custom, specialised medical equipment and packs.
